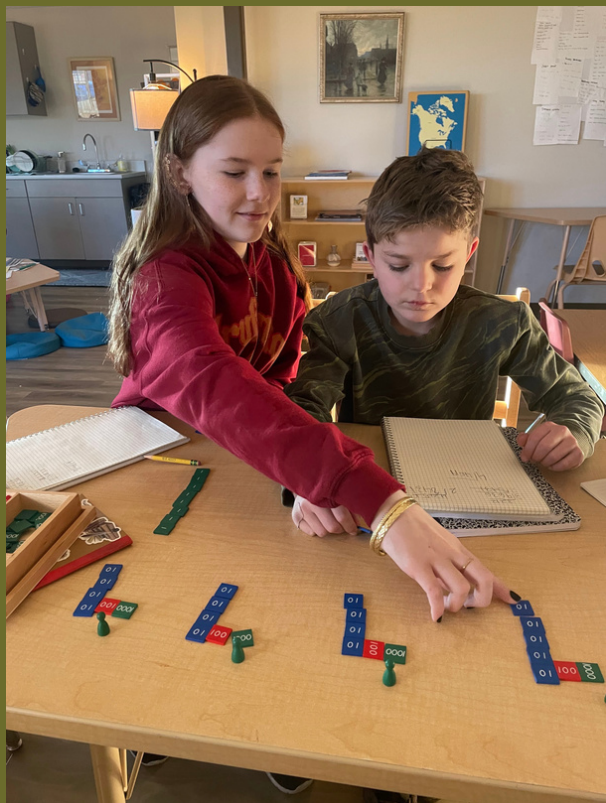
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Montessori Minute With Anna Nation

You may have heard your child talk about “work time” or “morning work cycle” when referencing their day at school. The three hour work cycle was a concept first established by Dr. Montessori when she built her educational pedagogy. This work time is a full three hours of work driven by small group learning and independently chosen Montessori work. The work cycle is never disrupted by large group gatherings, but instead offers all students the opportunity to work at a self-directed pace under the guidance of Montessori teachers. The freedom that a full 3 hour work time offers allows children to build their self-discipline around intense and ambitious work and allows time for natural rest and socialization. The work cycle is the central synergy that drives the child’s development in the Montessori classroom.
